The Honorable Jaime Oaxaca currently is chairman of The Oaxaca Group-Hispanic Marketing and also serves as Vice Chairman of Coronado Communications Corporation.

He received a Presidential Appointment from George Bush as a member of the National Science Board between 1990 and 1996; a Presidential Appointment and Senate confirmation from Ronald Reagan to the General Advisory Committee on Arms Control and Disarmament between 1982 and 1993 and was a candidate for Secretary of Transportation in 1987. He was then appointed by the President's Science Advisor to co-chair the Task Force on Women, Minorities and the Handicapped in Science & Technology, 1987-1990.

In 1980 he was named a Distinguished Fellow of the Institute for the Advancement of Engineering and was a candidate for Secretary of the Air Force in 1981. In 1992, he was honored as a Distinguished Alumnus of the University of Texas, El Paso, and has received additional high honors, including the National Science Foundation's "Lifetime Achievement Award." He also served as Board Member Chairman for the US/Mexico Foundation for Science in 2003. In addition, he served as Chairman of The Board of Directors of the U.S. Space Foundation in July 1999.

He received a B.S. in Electrical Engineering from The University of Texas at El Paso in 1957; he also was a Sloan Executive Fellow in the Graduate School of Business at Stanford University in 1972
